II. Opening Comments from the Co-Chairs	P Jehlicka	a. Perry Jehlicka noted the heavy agenda with a #1 goal to put the DETC policies and guidelines together by the end of the fall semester or the first of spring.



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III. Open Comments from the Public	Heidi Preschler	a. Heidi Preschler reported a pressing need for an online synchronous course.
IV. Discussion Items	Rick Shaw Dr. Parnell, R Shaw J Toth, S Lee	a. Upgrade of Luminous Portal Rick Shaw led discussion regarding the platform for course study, with the current platform ending December 21, 2015. Luminous has changed architecture; accessing and using the program is dramatically different. Course Studio is now called SITES. Options for platforms include AVC online, Blackboard or SITES; all will require a training cycle for faculty to make online materials available for student access. Rick led discussion in hopes to consolidate platforms. The Blackboard contract ends in 2017, which could necessitate training again. Consensus was to use Blackboard, with AVCOonline as an alternate. Rick will communicate the change to faculty. b. OEI (7) Modules – Availability to Students Item Tabled. c. Categories for Online Classes (Blended) Dr. Lee led discussion regarding adding a third category for online courses. Current types are <i>hybrid</i> and <i>online</i> . Guest Heidi Preschler noted physical presence on campus is required for hybrid or blended courses, and identified the need for online synchronous or asynchronous courses to accommodate students who cannot come to campus. It was suggested <i>web-enhanced</i> could suffice but would no longer fall under distance education; consensus was <i>web-enhanced</i> is not considered online. Dr. Lee explained the rates of a meeting are not defined in AP&P, and significant discussion will determine whether the option and management of a <i>web-enhanced</i> course,

Proposed Distance Education Course Categories DETC - October 27, 2015

Currently there are two categories of DE courses for AVC used by the Academic Policies & Procedures committee of the Academic Senate. These are the categories and their definitions (From the 2014-2015 AP&P Standards & Practices Handbook, p. 93):

Hybrid Course: a course designed to utilize some classroom-based instruction integrated with other modes of electronic instructional delivery: e.g. Internet, e-mail, video, discussion boards, multi media, etc. Hybrid courses meet both on-campus and online.

Online Course: a course designed to utilize methods of instruction entirely online. (No on-campus meetings required.)

It is proposed to change to the following three categories and definitions:

Online: a course designed for all instruction to take place online with no requirement for students to meet on campus at any time.

Hybrid: a course designed for all instruction to take place online. Students will be required to meet on campus for orientations, exams or other non-instructional activities.

Blended: a course designed for instruction to take place both online and in the classroom. Students will be required to engage in both formats concurrently.
