Completion rates Math

		 2018-2019 was 35%. 2019-2020 was 50%. AVC Completion rates English 2018-2019 was 57%. 2019-2020 was 66%. AVC Completion rates Math 2018-2019 was 24%. 2019-2020 was 49%. In the year 2019-2020 AVC no longer used placement tests to place students in courses. Instead used GPA from High School. When analyzing data we have to keep in mind the changes in placement procedures as well as the pandemic. Follow-up: We have to focus on what our next steps are in relation to this data. Will we need to pursue the creation of new programs?

The ethnicity that has the lowest completion rate is African-American. Overall trend for all ethnicities is upward.
