The Palmdale Center and Technology Annex are committed to fulfilling AVC's mission to "provide a quality comprehensive education to a diverse population of learners" to "transforms lives" by providing access to 86 in person sections in Fall 2023 with an expected 79 sections in Spring 2024. The center's location in the south Antelope Valley offers access, instruction, and services to its student population of over 3,400 (largely Hispanic/Latinx). Many of whom are from underserved populations, low income/wage earners, and diverse backgrounds. Additionally, the Palmdale Center offers comprehensive access to Student and Academic Support Services including counseling, OSD, financial aid, CalWorks, Library, and Learning Center. In tandem with the Dean of Social and Behavioral Sciences, the Palmdale Center via the Administrative Coordinator- Palmdale, provides administrative support for the Prison Education Program (Rising Scholars) program. Moving into the 2024-2025 AY, the Palmdale Center will continue its development of Palmdale GE and Transfer Degree Pathways, noncredit programs (including the existing ESL courses), Contract Education (workforce training programs), and the Makerspace/Innovation Hub at the Palmdale Technology Annex.

Strengths and Accomplishments: (Include your data analysis of success, retention, enrollment, completion rates OR other relevant metrics in your response.)

During the 2022-2023 AY, the Palmdale Center has provided access to instruction and comprehensive student services to over 7,000 AVC students. The Palmdale Center continues to support CTE certificates, GE and transfer programs, highlighted by its support of the SOAR South, AVC Rising Scholars – Prison Employment Program, Aircraft Fabrication and Assembly, and Industrial Manufacturing Technology Apprenticeship program. Antelope Valley College's Rising Scholars Prison Program achieved significant enrollment milestones during Spring and Fall 2023, with the collaborative efforts of the Administrative Coordinator, Prison liaisons,

Counselor, and Dean leading to the successful registration of over 300 students. Specifically, 330 students were registered during the Spring semester, followed by 237 students in the Fall.

As of this review's submission, in Fall 2023, the AVC Palmdale Center staff (classified and student employees) has provided point of contact service to 792 individuals. Additionally, the Palmdale Call Center has assisted in Outreach, Counseling, enrollment Services, RISE, and registration campaigns making 9856 calls this year. One of the crowning, annual events, the AVC Palmdale Summer Block Party nearly doubled from over 200 attendees in its inaugural year to 490 attendees and 178 volunteers and vendor participants. This event is focused on making connections with our community neighbors, like Olive Support Services, the City of Palmdale, and the Hispanic Chamber, while providing outreach to promote AVC's programs and commitment to student success in the Antelope Valley.

To better support and improve student success, the Palmdale Center will focus on the following to improve GPA, completion rates, enrollment, and the center's development. A general review of the data between Fall 2022 and 2023 shows a slight decline in GPA, Avg. AVC Earned hours, and Completion Rates.

- 1. Evaluate the instructional, student and academic support service spaces/schedules to maximize available classroom, lab, and additional spaces.
- 2. Improve communication, promotion, and coordination of Academic Support Services.
- 3. Increase student access and promotion to the AVC Palmdale Bookstore and vending services.
- 4. Develop Palmdale GE and Transfer Pathways to improve access, enrollment, and retention at the Palmdale Center.
- 5. Develop Career Development and College Preparedness Noncredit and Contract Education Workforce Development Training.
- 6. Plan and host outreach events with community partners to promote AVC programs and strengthen relationships.
- 7. Evaluate and create an appropriate center infrastructure to successfully execute and support AVC Palmdale initiatives.

Moving into the 2024-2025 AY, the Palmdale Center will continue its advancement of Palmdale GE and Transfer Degree Pathways, noncredit programs, Contract Education (workforce training programs), and the Makerspace/Innovation Hub at the Palmdale Technology Annex. Additionally, the cener will support the PEP program's development of degree plans in Communications and History and Liberal Arts and Sciences (LAS), indicating a commitment to expanding academic offerings and opportunities for incarcerated individuals in the future. The collaboration between key stakeholders has played a pivotal role in the program's success, fostering a positive environment for education and rehabilitation within the prison system.

At its inception, the Palmdale Center was intended to provide clear GE and transfer pathways to the AVC demographic in the south Antelope Valley. Importantly, the Palmdale Center will work to establish its identity as a primary provider of equitable education, workforce development training, and services to the immediate surrounding communities.



Cohort Palmdale Other AVC Stud.. Cohort Selector (\* Prior Term) Cohort Palmdale










Number of Students by City/Zip Code (works as Filter as well) Feed


