I. Opening comments from the Co-chairs	<i>Scott Lee/Kathy Bakhit</i>	<p>The meeting was called to order at 3:06pm. Dr. Lee welcomed everyone and said that we will need to have an additional meeting on 11/30/23. One large group we are working on is the Work Experience courses. It has gotten complicated from the state. Let's see where we are next week.</p> <p>Question: "Isn't there any way to speed the meeting up?"</p> <p>Dr. Lee replied that we have to go through the agenda course by course. It's law.</p> <p>Question: "Is it possible to speed up going through it one at a time?"</p> <p>Dr. Lee said, "No." It's the law to go one at a time for substantial courses and programs.</p> <p>Comment: Can the committee split?</p> <p>Dr. Lee replied that we have to meet quorum. There is little room for flexibility.</p>

Informational Item</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Meeting schedule: 11/16/23, 1/25/24, 2/8/24, 2/22/24, 3/14/24, 3/28/24, 4/11/24, 4/25/24 – Work Experience – Courses/Programs reviewed by Tech Review Workgroup – Meeting Modality 	<p>Scott Lee</p>	<p>Informational Items Work Experience: Dr. Lee said that the work experience courses are all at Stage 2, with the intention that it would be easier to look at them in this stage. There are currently some matters up in the air with the Chancellor's Office. They are supposed to send further guidance on repeatability. However, they were referencing the wrong part of the law.</p> <p>Dr. Bakhit said that they referenced part of Title 5 that had been deleted. She will update everyone as she receives more information.</p> <p>Dr. Lee said that we currently have 38 work experience courses, and we need to do something now. There has been no official discussion yet. He is leaning towards removing repeatability because it is the safest move. If you want repeatability, you will need to redo the course next year.</p>

		<p>Dr. Bakhit recommended holding off until January. Comment: Robyn Serrano said that these are all substantial changes that will affect Banner and scheduling. Comment: Katheryn Mitchell asked how it will affect it. Comment: Robyn said that if we don't bring it back until January and Senate goes to February, it will bring it into March. Comment: Katheryn Mitchell said that we have approved things for spring in the fall before. It shouldn't be a problem. Dr. Bakhit asked if it is a substantial change. Comment: "Yes, it is substantial." Dr. Lee recommends removing repeatability now and changing it next year.</p> <p>Meeting Modality: Dr. Lee said that we need to meet quorums in the room. This law has a time limit of three months. The ability to meet online has to stop after this semester. The question is for people visiting, if they will also have to be in the room.</p>
<p>IV. Discussion – Submission Timeline</p>	<p><i>Scott Lee</i></p>	<p>Discussion Submission Timeline: Dr. Bakhit explained that we have reviewed a lot of workflows (referring to the agenda). To have it all done in the fall is becoming stressful and impossible. One strategy that was recommended and has been considered, is what would come for review in fall 2024 may shift into spring 2024. We are open to ideas on how to tackle this. Some faculty may be willing to do it early and volunteer. Another approach would be to look at which programs have substantial changes and prioritize them that way. Dr. Lee said that it will require hitting deadlines in the spring; like March, April, and May. Comment: Wendy Stout asked if it will be for 2026. Dr. Lee said it will be in 2025. Dr. Bakhit said that it depends on the types of changes. Hypothetically, if they are done by May, maybe we can do an addendum for the catalog.</p>



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		<p>Staff have been working overtime to ensure that everything is getting done. To spread out the workload, we can do it through spring. We can come up with a list of items to see what should be moved to spring.</p> <p>Dr. Lee said we would like to start in spring of 2024. It should make it easier.</p> <p>Comment: Kathryn Mitchell asked if this is moving toward the schedule plan to review by discipline? Dr. Lee said yes, it is moving toward that plan. We are currently doing everything in October and November.</p> <p>Dr. Bakhit said that if everyone agrees, we will provide an update.</p>

It was an option available when eLumen was installed that was not taken. We have no process for tracking maximum capacity, so we are entering it into the Minutes. This is an issue to tackle in the Spring.</p> <p>Classroom capacity: 30</p> <p>Dr. Bakhit asked what the maximum is for History. Comment: 35-40 is the average for History.</p> <p>Comment: Sociology is anywhere from 30-40 maximum.</p> <p>Dr. Bakhit asked if there is any reason why we wouldn't go for 35 classroom maximum, based on the average.</p> <p>Comment: Francisco said that he can see how it would be appropriate for those courses with an introductory. But for those that don't have it, he would ask for a maximum of 30. ETHN 106, 110, 111 should have 30.</p> <p>Dr. Bakhit said that we need to be able to uphold this for other disciplines. She recognizes the process here and it needs to be part of a bigger conversation.</p> <p>Comment: Wendy Stout said that she agrees that there is a lot of grading involved.</p> <p>Comment: Hal Huntsman said that the issue of caps, as a whole, is a big issue that AP&P has a voice in, but not the last word on. It's appropriate to bring it up and record it for the Senate. This is a bigger discussion that needs to continue. We need to have a pedagogical discussion and consider the financial consequences involved as well.</p> <p>Dr. Lee said that the Administration, Senate, and Union all need to all be part of this conversation. Right now, we need to have a method to record it.</p> <p>Kathy Bakhit said that she is new to the campus, and she is trying to be thoughtful in her approach. She is prioritizing. She recognizes that she needs to prioritize, work through the issues, and make progress. It needs to be collaborative, and everyone has an opportunity to provide input. Curriculum is the core of the campus. There are limited funds to spread out for everything that needs to be done. She asks everyone to please be patient as we go through this.</p>
