III. DISCUSSION ITEMS

Issues concerning the previous Club Rush were discussed: more people showed interest in the Library Plaza than the HS building.

The winner of the raffle is Chris Hamilton, who has until Thursday, February 27, 2014 to pick it up. Also, \$25 were raised by the raffle.

The new Skills USA representative introduced themselves: Philana Walker.

Club competition guidelines will be e-mailed out to the whole campus.

Lancaster Jet Hawks representative explained fundraising opportunities: by choosing a date with Jet Hawks (all days except July 4th and preferably a Friday when there are fireworks, starting March 23rd, or a Saturday when there are giveaways, starting April 5th) clubs will be given tickets to sell for \$8 apiece and can keep half of that. Other things, like going down to throw the first pitch, can also be organized.

STEM brought up the idea of making an event there at the end of the semester to celebrate being done with classes: perhaps \$1 can be given to ASO for every ticket sold and the other \$3 will go to the respective clubs who sold it. Kirk Truax will be taking charge of planning this event.

- SNAC Fall 2014 moved for their Popcornopolis fundraiser from March 5th to March 26th, ASL seconded, motion passed unanimously. Also, moved

to start designing sweatshirts to sell, Possibilities seconded, motion passed unanimously.

- Alpha Iota moved for (a) their Spring Convention on April 4th-6th to San Jose, with around 30 students participating and 2 advisors, (b) a Soccer Tournament, together with the AV Student Soccer Club, where advertising and sign-ups will take place every Thursday and Monday for the month of March in the Library Plaza for \$3 fee prior to the competition and \$5 on the day of the competition, which the tournament will be on April 14th, Possibilities seconded, motion passed unanimously.
- Psychology moved for their trip to the Dr. Phil show to advertise on March 24th, Possibilities seconded, motion passed unanimously.
- Skills USA moved for their trip to San Diego, on April 14th, to observe how other Skills Clubs compete in hopes to compete the following year, Possibilities seconded, motion passed unanimously.
- STEM moved to (a) represent their club at the AV Air Show on March 22nd and 23rd and (b) to have a Mathletes competition on April 18th from 12:00 to 2:30 PM in the Student Lounge, ASL seconded, motion passed unanimously.
- ASL moved for their Silent Game Night to be combined with a presentation about adapting deaf studies in classrooms on March 14th in the Cafeteria starting at 5:30 PM, food will be provided, Possibilities seconded, motion passed unanimously.
- SNAC Spring 2015 moved to make their own designs for sweaters, SNAC Fall 2014 seconded, motion passed unanimously.
