Hearts and Hands Pantry is having their annual Thanksgiving meal collaboration to feed 25 families, they are asking clubs to help raise funds and donate \$44.99 per meal for a family; also mentioned having a potluck on Nov. 20th at 4 PM for the clubs who help out.

AVC Stem Club moved a Trip Request for their Aviation and Rocketry Committee to launch rockets on an overnight trip at Lucerne Dry Lake Bed on Nov. 9th and 10th for ROCstock, Fashion & Costume Society seconded, (Discussion: Dr. Zimmerman reminded the group of the issue about trip requests and how they must be brought before the Board of Trustees' for Liability Insurance reasons and therefore this trip may not be processed in time since the Board of Trustees will not be meeting in time for the trip), motion passed unanimously. AVC Stem Club also moved for future plans for a LA Science Center trip request for December 8th, Fashion & Costume Society seconded, motion passed unanimously.

AVC Fire Academy reported their successful event at Home Depot where they taught 110 children and their families fire safety and announced their plans for three car washes to fundraise for their Thanksgiving Event for meals for families; also to gather toys and meals for the Holidays. Car washes will be in Santa Clarita, Palmdale, and Lancaster. [Note: must get car wash days approved, will e-mail them to Nancy.]
