### 6.1 Advisor Reports

Dr. Z reminded members that they have to get facilities requests 3 weeks in advance for their events. This rule will be more strictly enforced from here on out. Dr. Z also asked if members had a suggestion for the name of the AVC newsletter. It is currently “Marauder 411.” After some discussion, members agreed they preferred “Marauder Monthly” for the name. Leidy Villarreal suggested a column be added to the newsletter that highlights some of the AVC staff and their hard work.

Alpha Iota discussed their Convention trip during Spring break—it was a huge success with two members winning awards, the club also won “Best Name Tag,” and they thanked ASO for making the trip possible by covering 75% of the costs.

## VII. ANNOUNCEMENTS / UPCOMING MEETING AND EVENTS

Alpha Iota reminded members about their Spring Hawaiian themed Dance on April 18<sup>th</sup> from 6 to 9 pm and that ticket sales will be on Tuesday, April 8<sup>th</sup>, and Wednesday, April 9<sup>th</sup>, from 11 to 3 pm. *This announcement prompted a discussion about the issue of security for the dance since the dance wishes to be open to non-AVC-students for those with dates who don't go to AVC. When people outside of the college come to an AVC event, Dr. Z reminded, security needs to be hired for the event. However, Nathan Skadsen wondered if security is needed if a “plus 1” is added when the tickets are sold making it more outside people to come to the dance. Such an addition would make the student buying the ticket liable for whoever they bring, not making security necessary. Dr. Z acknowledged this as a possible solution and this would be further discussed outside of the ICC meeting.*

The next ICC meeting will be April 21, 2014, in SSV 180 boardroom at 3 pm. The Alpha Iota Soccer Tournament and Jet Hawks game will be on April 19<sup>th</sup>.
