With us going over it, we did find some issues with it. In 2022 to 2025, it heavily focuses on 15 to finish – I don't really think this is entirely realistic for most students. Anyone taking over 12, their eyes get big and they feel it is a lot. The labs and the extra studying – you would have to take 5 3-unit classes – we don't think it is realistic as we go to community college and we cannot afford to take that many classes with all of the other responsibilities piled on. Students are getting C's instead of better grades by taking so many classes. This also affects transfer rates. Sticking between 9 and 12 units. Jill – how long have you been here? 3 years Jill – it is time based, like high school. Each time you delay, it delays your revenue. I think it should be more realistic and major based. The courseload seems too heavy in the 15 to finish.
